








Pressure on Revenue




Note: The remaining 13% is made up of various revenue sources.

Providing access through affordability with Rutgers Institutional Aid


Areas where the University has seen increases in the past are consumables, service contract escalations, construction / renovation costs, and food services















New Brunswick & Comparators - Big 10 Institutions







Rutgers FY20 "Unrestricted Net Position" \$506 million *


<u>Endowment (Operating and Quasi) 42%</u> - Includes BOG and BOT reserves for need-based student aid, funds for student merit aid, funds held by schools/centers/departments for current and future strategic initiatives.

<u>Faculty Funds 22%</u> - Funds committed to individual faculty members to support research initiatives.

<u>Operations & Loans 16%</u> - Funds held for department-funded financial aid and strategic initiatives, multi-year projects, one-time support services, and capital reserves for Auxiliary Enterprises.

<u>Capital Projects 10%</u> - Funding for deferred maintenance and construction projects in progress, such as ongoing residence hall renovation and other construction projects across all campuses. Balances will change as funds are set aside for capital projects or used when completing those projects.


<u>Insurance Funds 10%</u> - Support of the University's self-insurance program.

Ratio of Spendable Cash & Investments to Operating Expense





> FY 2021

- Instituted: hiring freeze, voluntary salary reductions, limits on salary increases, moratorium on discretionary spending and travel, "hibernation" of buildings to limit spending; furlough program; and halting capital project planning
- Strategically used federal relief funds to support and protect our students, faculty and staff

> FY 2022

- Ongoing concerns about incoming classes and retention as well as international student enrollments
- Uncertainty about the continued impacts resulting from the pandemic what will "normal" look like
- Continue monitoring spending limits
- Continue to strategically use limited federal relief funds to help bridge funding gaps over the next year
- Reserve funding to provide stable sources of funds during what could be a prolonged period of relatively unpredictable economic conditions



Restructuring Mandatory Fees

Mandatory Fee Structure



The University will be restructuring and redefining its mandatory fees to describe their purposes and intended uses more accurately. These updates are intended only to add clarity to a structure that has evolved over many years and has become confusing and contradictory. The restructuring is for the applicable student fees at the New Brunswick (includes the RBHS traditional BS Nursing program and the School of Pharmacy), Newark and Camden campuses.

The total charges for fees will not change as a result of this updating.

The current definitions/titles will be changed:


- The Campus Fee will become the Student Fee
- The Student Government Fee will be moved from the School Fee to Student Fee
- ➤ The Capital Improvement Fee (currently in the Student Fee) will be included in the School Fee
- > The Computer Fee will become the Technology Fee
- > The Off-Campus Fee will become the Offsite Instructional Support Fee

The Student Fee replaces the current Campus Fee and is charged to all full-time and part-time students at the New Brunswick (includes the traditional BS Nursing program and the School of Pharmacy), Newark and Camden campuses to support a portion, but not all, student-centered activities including: student life, student government, recreation, health services, athletics, career counselling, tutoring and other programs that are integral to a vibrant student life and to successful academic careers.

These fees vary by campus and full-time or part-time student status.

The School Fee provides funding for additional costs that are unique to the needs and the operation of individual undergraduate and graduate schools and programs.

The Capital Improvement Fee, at the New Brunswick (includes the traditional BS Nursing program and the School of Pharmacy), Newark and Camden campuses, will now be included in the School Fee and will reflect the operation, maintenance, utilities and debt service associated with facilities utilized by each school or program.

These fees vary by school and full-time or part-time student status.


The Technology Fee provides funding for student technology services that include network infrastructure and software that supports instructional activities. It also helps to fund technology used in classrooms and labs for courses requiring computer interaction.

The Technology Fee replaces the Computer Fee at the New Brunswick (includes the traditional BS Nursing program and the School of Pharmacy), Newark and Camden campuses.

Offsite Instructional Support Fee

The Offsite Instructional Support Fee is mandatory only for a **limited** number of Rutgers students who are enrolled in offsite degree completion programs at community colleges or other offsite locations, and for some students enrolled in continuing studies courses.

This fee replaces the Off-Campus Fee, a title that no longer reflects the current teaching model that includes remote instruction, online learning and other applications. These fees vary by program and full-time or part-time student status.



The changes proposed by these updates will not result in changes to a student's fees, but merely a reallocation of those fees
